RIDDLE OF THE WEEK

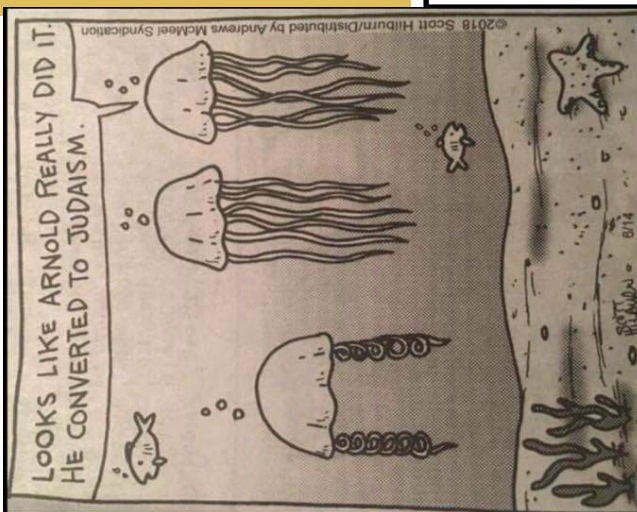
