Why don't we usually answer Amen after our own Bracha? When do we?

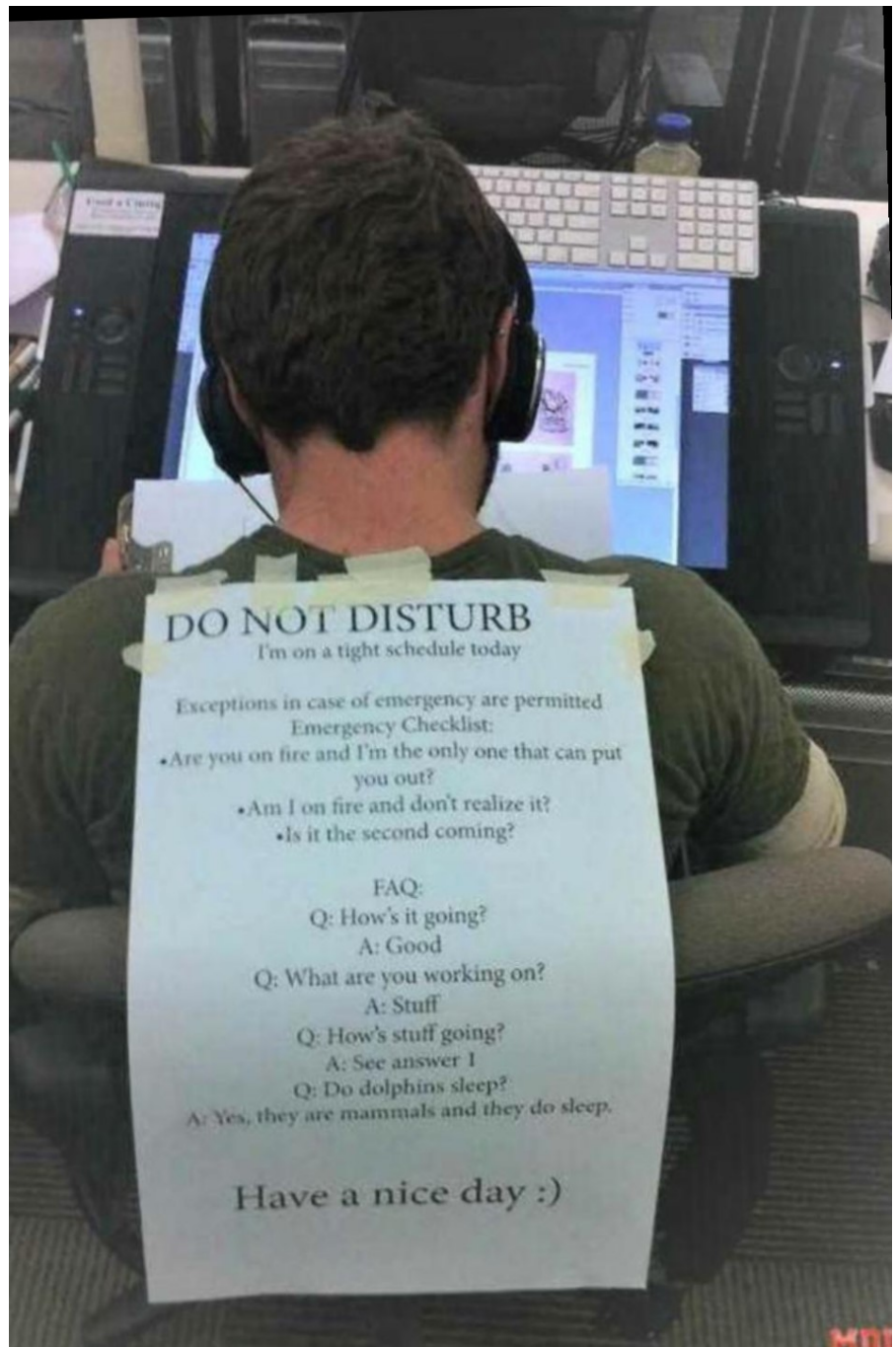
