"Is this Zaidy?" the little boy asked, stroking his grandfather's hair.

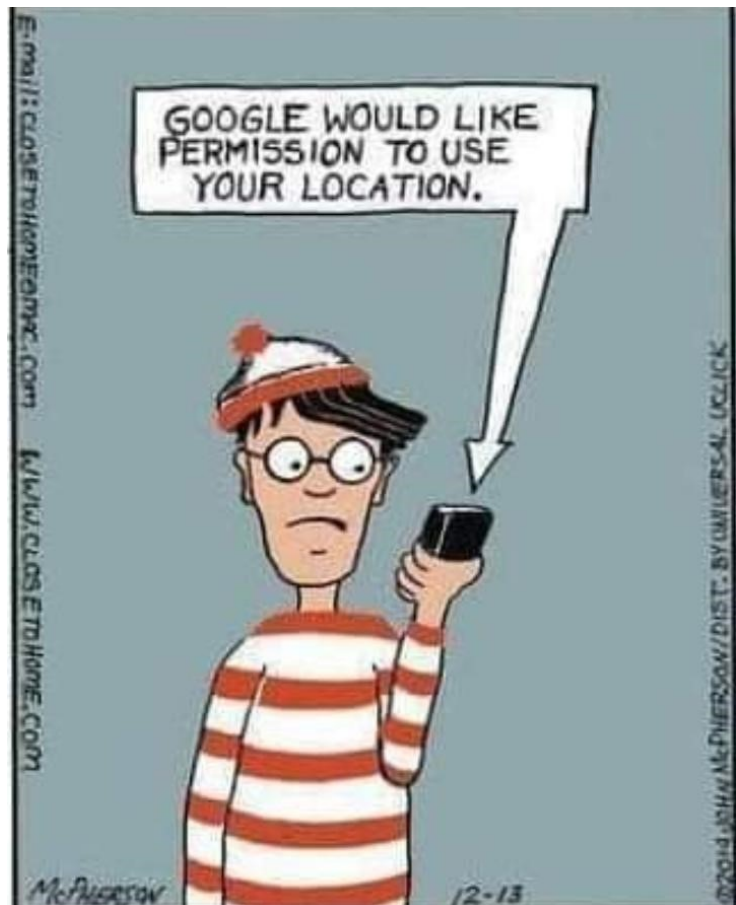
"No, that's Zaidy hair," corrected his grandfather.
